Several members of the Gulf of Maine Council have been working together with partner organizations to plan for a multi-day symposium – *Gulf of Maine 2050: Challenges and Opportunities for Regional Resilience*. The symposium will take place November 4-8, 2019 at The Westin Portland Harborview in Portland, Maine. A separate workshop, April 9-11, 2019 at Huntsman Marine Science Centre, will focus on development of scenario papers.

Gulf of Maine 2050

The Gulf of Maine 2050 international symposium will integrate environmental, economic, social, and institutional perspectives on emerging climate challenges and opportunities. It will bring together multiple science disciplines, natural resource managers, municipal planners, representatives from key industries, a diverse mix of community leaders, non-governmental organizations, and the donor community to understand how the Gulf of Maine is expected to change in the next 30 years. Leaders from across New England and the Maritime Provinces will come together to build a shared vision for regional resilience, identify steps necessary to achieve that vision, and activate new collaborations for action.

Key Events, Dates and Locations

Gulf of Maine 2050 - Strategic Scenarios Workshop

April 9-11, 2019 | Hunstman Marine Science Centre | St. Andrews, New Brunswick, Canada

Interdisciplinary teams will meet together to develop scenarios for key issues related to the Gulf of Maine in 2050. These scenarios will provide strategic insight about how potential changes related to climate and other factors could impact the Gulf of Maine environmental, community, and economic conditions over the next 30 years. Expert scenario papers will be developed and circulated in advance of the November 2019 Gulf of Maine 2050 Symposium. Potential topics include the impacts of ocean acidification, sea level rise, warming waters, and extreme precipitation / storms on aquaculture and fisheries, watershed ecology, coastal communities, policy and governance, maritime economy, and public health.

Gulf of Maine 2050 - Symposium

November 4 – 8, 2019 | The Westin Portland Harborview | Portland, Maine, US

Multi-day symposium will include a mix of presentations, panel discussions, and breakout discussions / workshops aimed at addressing the following key questions:

- What conditions can we expect in and around the Gulf of Maine in 2050?
- > What ecological, economic, social, and management challenges will arise from anticipated changes in the Gulf of Maine?
- What are our key vulnerabilities to future changes and what are our most promising opportunities?
- What are the most important research priorities and management actions to increase resilience?
- How can diverse Gulf of Maine stakeholders best work together to achieve shared priorities?

Each day of the conference will be organized around primary drivers such as warming waters, sea level rise and ocean acidification in the Gulf of Maine. Plenary speakers will describe how global drivers will impact the region. Practitioners will share how various drivers impact their interests and highlight opportunities. Breakout sessions will foster deep conversations and development of shared priorities and strategies among stakeholders. Poster sessions will provide an opportunity to share cutting-edge science. Detailed program is in development.
